Food & Water Watch and director Liz Miller have joined forces for a six-month tour of this award-winning documentary.

The tour will visit over 30 cities and 40 universities across the United States including: Ann Arbor, Ypsilanti, Pittsburg, Erie, Rochester, Buffalo, Ithaca, Syracuse, Albany, Mt Pleasant, Des Moines, Hartford, Boston, Chicago, Grand Rapids, Lansing, Benton Harbor, Flint, New York City, Minneapolis, Madison, Traverse City, Duluth, Toledo, Cleveland, Akron, Dayton, Washington D.C., and many more cities all around the Great Lakes basin.
